

# VEHICLE, TRAFFIC AND PARKING ORDINANCES

## City of Bangor Code of Ordinances

### **CHAPTER NUMBER AND TITLE**

#### **71.00 – UNIFORM TRAFFIC CODE**

##### **71.02 – Municipal Parking Lot Regulations**

- (B) – No commercial or freight carrying vehicle or trailer shall be parked in a city parking lot.
- (C) – It shall be unlawful to park any car in a municipal parking lot for a period longer than 12 hours in any one day.
- (D) – All municipal parking lots shall be closed for all vehicle and pedestrian traffic and any other use or purpose between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

##### **71.03 – Overnight Parking Prohibited**

- (A) – No vehicle shall be parked on any street or streets within the city between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 7:00 a.m., except on M-43 between Center and Division Street. No vehicle shall be parked on M-43 between Center and Division Street within the City between 2:30 a.m. and 7:00 a.m.

#### **96.00 – OUTDOOR STORAGE OF VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT**

##### **96.01 – Definitions**

Inoperable Motor Vehicle – A vehicle which, by dismantling, disrepair or any other reason, is incapable of being propelled under its own power, and any vehicle which has a main component part missing or unattached. *(For purposes of this section a vehicle must have its own battery, be able to start and roll on its own power.)*

##### **96.02 – Parking or Storing Certain Items On Lands Within the City**

No person, firm or corporation shall park or store on any lands within the City, any dismantled, partially dismantled or inoperable motor vehicle, machinery or equipment, or parts thereof, except as may be permitted under pertinent provisions of other ordinances of the City, unless said dismantled, partially dismantled or inoperable motor vehicle, machinery or equipment, or parts thereof, shall be kept in a wholly enclosed garage or structure. Maximum temporary storage time of an owner of the vehicle on land owned by him or rented by him is 48 hours. This does not allow parking of said motor vehicles, machinery or equipment on any street.

#### **97.00 – STREETS AND SIDEWALKS**

##### **97.30 – Purposes**

The parking, storage or leaving unattended of any motor vehicle, truck, off-road or all terrain vehicle, trailer, portable living quarters or similar property in any front yard of any area not approved as an improved driveway in the City is declared to be a nuisance and is prohibited.

### **97.35 – Prohibited Acts**

- (A) – No person shall place, park or store a motor vehicle in any front yard of a residential premises.
- (B) – No owner or person having charge, custody, control or use of any premises shall park, store or permit the parking or storage of, any motor vehicle or other item of property described in 97.30 in any front yard of a residential premises in the City.
- (C) – No parking on the tree lawn where there is a curb on the street.

### **154.083 – Additional Requirements**

No trucks over  $\frac{3}{4}$  tons shall be parked in a residential area over two (2) consecutive hours, except pick-up trucks. (Ord. 205, passed 1-16-95)

### **154.058 – Special Use Required for use of lot as ‘Truck or Bus Terminal.’**

This section means that a truck left running or a truck with a refrigeration unit left running uses the lot as a ‘truck terminal’. Further, the City Council has allowed use of the lot on Charles and Maple (across from Kids Place) as a parking area only. Terminal status has not been granted.

### **SNOWMOBILES, OFF-ROAD VEHICLES**

By City Council action and in accordance with State Statutes governing the operation of snowmobiles, snowmobile are only permitted along Center Street - a north / south corridor through town. They may also drive from Center Street on Charles Street to Walnut Street to Monroe Street. This allows snowmobiles the opportunity to come into town for gasoline.

### **154.053/054 - Residential Uses**

No operating of snowmobiles or other off-road vehicles on public rights-of-way or on residential parcels.
