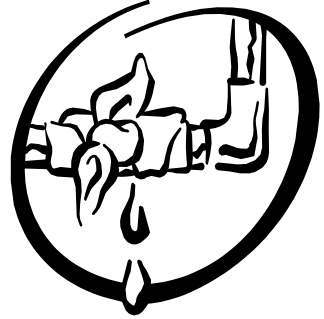


## Water Leaks Are Costly

The biggest complaint we hear from customers is that they think their water bill is high. We ask if a customer has a leak (or had) any leaking faucets, toilets, water softeners or showerheads. We also ask to visit the home and check for leaks ourselves. You would be amazed at the leaks we find that the homeowner didn't know about. Not all leaks make noise (especially toilets).



**Leaks are very costly!** People are also amazed that even a small leak can be so costly. Leaks run 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Check for leaking faucets, showerheads, water softeners and toilets regularly. Repair leaks promptly.



**Money down the drain!** That's what happens when you allow a leak to run. You pay for the water and you pay again for sewer. It's expensive and you can help yourself by fixing leaks quickly.

- A leak as small as 1/32" wastes 170 gallons every 24 hours.
- A leak 1/16 of inch in diameter wastes 600 gallons every 24 hours
- A leak 1/8' in diameter waste 2,500 gallons every 24 hours.
